## Unitarian Universalists of New Braunfels Guidelines for Covenant Violations at UUNB

## Introduction:

The Board of Trustees (BOT) created this document, with guidance from the Committee on Ministry (COM), to clearly define how to handle covenant violations.

## The BOT and COM agree that:

- "A covenant is not a contract; it is an aspiration. It cannot be enforced by consequences, but may be reinforced by forgiveness. It comes from the word <u>covenir</u> "to travel together." We covenant to walk together across disagreements and dissent, cherishing the way we walk as dearly as any outcome."
- the key means of restoring relations would best be achieved by underpinning the value of reconciliation as a practice of one's faith.
- covenantal violations relative to "right-relations" and the underlying premise of "assuming good intent" should be addressed by a "designated representative"
- the designated representative should be the minister, Rev. Addae
- interventions should be enacted quickly and confidentially

## Guidelines

- I. When a violation of UUNB convenant is witnessed by an individual(s), that individual should notify the parties of the perceived breach of covenant.
- II. The witness should inform those involved in the conflict that Rev. Addae will be contacted to support their reconciliation.
- III. Whether the witness confronts the situation or not, in order to facilitate a return to right relations, he or she should contact Rev. Addae as soon as possible, providing a detailed description of his/her perspective of the incident.
- IV. Rev. Addae will contact each party privately and independently, offering her support as a means to facilitate a face to face meeting as well as the option for her help in mediation as a means to assist in reconciling the relationship.
